Message from new SENDCo

Hello, I am Charlotte Monk, the new SENDCo here at Curry Rivel C of E Primary School. I have been working as a fully qualified SENDCo since 2018 and have taught children from Reception up to Year Six.

The first couple of weeks at the school will be spent prioritising those children with EHCPs, medical and/or high needs.

My working days are Monday, Thursday and Friday. Please remember that all teachers are teachers of SEND, so if you have any initial concerns or queries, do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher.

I am very excited to start working with the staff, children and families within the school and look forward to seeing some of you at the SEND cafe drop-ins.

Clubs

Teachers run a range of after school clubs as part of our enrichment offer. These are outlined below, and can be booked through School Money. Don't forget that we have Apple Trees wraparound provision from 7.45am to 5.30pm- see out website or contact the school office for more details.

PE

Post COVID, children enjoyed weekly PE lessons with the 'Daily Mile' so we could focus on increasing fitness after a challenging period of home learning. This year, all classes will have two full PE lessons a week following an exciting programme developed by our PE Lead, Mr Bridgeman. Each class has a half term of swimming lessons, with Blenheim class going this half term. Children look very smart in their PE uniform-School PE hoodies are an option on PE days, available through brigade- but school jumpers and cardigans are also fine for PE days.

Water and snacks

Please can water bottles be labelled. Reception and Key Stage one pupils have fruit provided; older children can bring in fruit, vegetable or a savoury sandwich to eat at morning break- please not crisps or bars for snack time.

Premises

The school grounds at Curry Rivel are amazing- we are so lucky to have so much space, a large hall, front and back playgrounds, a field and an Orchard- many smaller village schools would be envious. As head teacher, I have high expectations for the school premises as I believe that the surroundings for both staff and pupils impact on how they feel about being here. Not only does our school look great because it is uncluttered and tidy, it also means that children and staff can access resources easily and it also reduces risk of accidents etc. Over the summer we have had the following works completed

- New upper school toilets and cubicles (In Curry Rivel mauve tones of course!)
- New hygiene room to support pupils with special needs
- New tarmacked rear playground
- New path through bark area.

Accelerated Reader

Our accelerated reader portal that allows children to take comprehension quizzes in school has been updated by our provider over the summer. Unfortunately, we have experienced some technical difficulties and have been unable to set up our new classes ready for the new term. This means that there has been a delay in children being able to complete their quizzes and undertaking their star reader assessments. We are working hard to try and rectify these issues and are hopeful that they will be sorted soon.

Well Being

WE are committed to supporting every child's well-being with a well-planned PSHE curriculum, with a relational approach to behavior and by having Place2Be provision at lunchtime if children need someone to talk to (Mrs Langford out school ELSA). For the adults, one of governors, Simon Gambrill, brings this to our attention:

Sunday 10th September is World Suicide Prevention Day. A day held each year to raise awareness of suicide and to promote actions in how we can reduce the number of suicides and suicide attempts.

Every year has a different theme and focus, and this year is '**Creating Hope Through Action'**. This acts as a reminder that there is an alternative to suicide and that our actions, no matter how big or small, can provide hope and support to those who are struggling and experiencing crisis, or have been bereaved by suicide.

On average nearly 3000 people commit suicide daily, according to the World Health Organization. For every person who completes a suicide, 20 or more may attempt to end their lives. Globally, about 1,000,000 people die due to suicide every year. That is 1 person every 32 seconds. Every suicide is devastating and it has a profound impact on the people around them. Friends, family, work colleagues and the local community really struggle to understand and make sense of why a person completed suicide.

World Suicide Prevention Day gives organizations, government agencies and individuals the chance to promote awareness about suicide, mental illnesses associated with suicide, as well as suicide prevention.

Many people struggle to cope at one point or another in their lives. Reaching out to someone could help them know that someone cares, that they are valued and help them to access the support they need.
