### 150 Years History Day: Message from Mrs van Cole

This year, Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School celebrates being 150 years old! As part of the celebrations, we would like children to take part in a 'History Day' at school, where all classes will learn about the colourful history of the school. The children will get to be historians for the day, by handling artefacts and historical items that have been saved in our school archives. As well as this, we will be having some visitors who the children can interview to find out more about what school life was like in the past.

As part of the day, we invite all children and staff to dress up on **Monday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2025** from one of the following eras to highlight particular parts of our school history:

- Victorians
- World War 2
- 70s or 80s

We encourage home-made, simple outfits and accessories, and expensive costumes do not need to be bought for this event. Teachers will give the children some ideas of how they can dress up for each era, so children can choose between them.
