Anti-Bullying Week

Anti-Bullying Week 2023 is coordinated in England and Wales by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. The week will start off with Odd Socks Day on Monday 13th November, where adults and children wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique. This will be followed up in the week by a special assembly and class lessons. The theme of 'Make A Noise About Bullying' came about following consultation with teachers and pupils by the Anti-Bullying Alliance which coordinates Anti-Bullying Week every year in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. Teachers and children wanted a theme that empowered them to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes.

Following the success of the campaign in 2022 – when 80% of schools marked the week, reaching over 7.5 million children and young people – Anti-Bullying Week will remind everyone whether it's in school, at home, in the community or online, we can bring an end to bullying.

At Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School, we take all forms of bullying very seriously, and always encourage children to 'tell a trusted adult'. Parents/carers are also encouraged to share their concerns with us so that we can take action.

Today, we gathered at 11am in the hall, as a school community, for a minute's silence to reflect on this important day. Of course, 'remembrance' means different things to different people, but the children were so well behaved and really showed respect during this event.
