SEND / PFSA Cafe

We are very excited to welcome parents/carers to our SEND/PFSA cafe again this term. This term's cafe will be held 2pm Wednesday 12th March. It gives parent/carers the chance to talk through any concerns, share experiences and ask questions in a safe and open environment.

Lockdown

As part of our Health and Safety policies and procedures, the school/nursery has a Lock down Policy. On very rare occasions, it may be necessary to seal off the school so that it cannot be entered from the outside. This will ensure that pupils, staff and visitors are safe in situations where there is a hazard in the school grounds or outside the school in the near vicinity. A lockdown is implemented when there are serious security risks for the premises due to, for example, nearby chemical spillage, proximity of dangerous dogs, serious weather conditions or attempted access by unauthorised persons intent in causing harm/damage. The message that will be shared to raise the alarm is 'Goose on the loose'. We follow the **CLOSE** procedure:

- Close all windows and doors
- Lock up
- Out of sight and minimise movement
- Stay silent and avoid drawing attention
- Endure: be aware you may be in lock down for some time
