

| Phoneme | A single unit of sound |
| Digraph | A type of grapheme where two letters represent one |
| | phoneme (sound) e.g. sh |
| | A type of grapheme where three letters represent |
| Trigraph | one phoneme (sound) e.g. igh |
| Consonants | Most of the letters of the alphabet represent |
| | consonants; b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, |
| | x, y, z. |
| Vowels | The letters a, e, i, o, u |
| Grapheme | A letter, or combination of letters, that corresponds |
| | to a single phoneme within a word e.g. ten |
| Segment | Break a word into phonemes for writing e.g. sh-ee-p |
| Blend | Put the phonemes together to read a word |
| Tricky word/Common | A word which can't be phonetically decoded e.g. was |
| exception word | |


