During the parents' evening, the school's parent teacher association (PTA) will be providing free refreshments in the hall where you can also view your child's books. Our Year 6 House Captains will be available to direct you to your child's classroom for your appointment. Mrs Monk will be available on Monday 31st March, and we hope to have the Parish Council here too!
