Pre-Existing Injuries

Reporting any pre-existing injuries your child may have to staff is really important; knowing about pre-existing injuries allows our staff to provide appropriate care and avoid activities that might exacerbate the injury. This ensures your child remains safe and comfortable while at school. Also, open communication between parents, carers, and school staff fosters trust and collaboration and may avoid us calling you when children show us their various accidental injuries.
