The PTA has a vision to fund enrichment activities across the Arts and this programme includes storytelling and drama which supports our curriculum.

### **No Outsider Parent Information Session**

As you know, we are improving our teaching and learning around issues of diversity and discrimination with the use of 'No Outsider's' resources. What is No Outsiders? The vision is inclusive education, promoting community cohesion to prepare young people and adults for life as global citizens. Last year, Andrew Moffatt, an experienced educator, and creator of the 'No Outsiders' resources, led workshops with pupils and staff. It is paramount that future generations are able to accept differences, accept the views of others and treat each other with respect, even if they disagree. We expect the children to express their views with kindness and consideration for the feelings of others. Our key message is that we are all equal and we all belong, we are all insiders, there are no outsiders in our school. There was an open opportunity to all families this week to look at the resources at a low-key information session on Wednesday- this gave parents the chance to listen to a short presentation by the Leadership Team, and to ask questions. Feedback included:

"Thank you for the information morning. I came thinking it was going to be very woke and pushing agendas on our children. After the workshop and seeing how No Outsiders works, this is not the case. They do not push agendas. They present children with age appropriate books/work that encourages them to take a step back and think. 'How would I feel in that situation?' Or ' finally a book that has a family like mine in it'. I'm very glad I attended as it has put my mind at ease knowing my children are being taught about multi-cultural backgrounds, disabilities, different family dynamics etc in this way."

### Wear Sky Blue Day

Thank you for supporting our non-uniform day 'wear sky blue' day in aid of Spinal Muscular Atrophy UK. We wish Mr Bridgeman all the best for the London Marathon, where he runs for the charity. All classes had a 'Daily Mile' experience today and challenged themselves to see how close they could collectively get to a marathon (262 laps) Adult laps counted too!
