Transition September 2023

The Year 6 pupils enjoyed a visit from the Head of Year 7 (Huish Academy) today so we really are starting the important transition for our oldest pupils. Today your child will bring home a letter outlining information on their new class for September. The governors and I are delighted to share with you that Curry Rivel Primary School is able to maintain the six-class structure we have had for the last four years. You will know that the construction of these classes changes depending on the Mrs Ali Pook



numbers we have in each year group. Each class will have approximately equal numbers of pupils (25-30 pupils).

Deliberate decisions have been made about the placement of the staff, and I hope you can trust that these decisions are made with the best outcomes of the children in mind. We are pleased that each class has a teaching assistant. Other teaching assistants will work as 'key adults' supporting specific pupils. Mrs Langford will continue to offer ELSA support.


As with all schools, we are dependent upon budgets which are dictated by a national funding formula, which hasn't always favoured smaller schools. We do not have a crystal ball, and hope that in future we can maintain what we think is a great class structure for your child to thrive and develop. It is important to be aware that there is a rapidly changing educational climate, especially given current circumstances, and it is important that we are all aware that changes in the future may be beyond our control (E.g in needing to reduce staffing or classes).

For Year 1 and Year 2 pupils, I have worked closely with the teachers to create the classes. The factors we try to take into account are: numbers of pupils, attainment, SEND needs, class dynamics, peers children work well with and friendships. Meetings and discussions are held over a period of time to establish the classes. It is important to note that Pippin, Maigold and Gala classes will continue to have playtimes and lunchtimes together, so Year 1 and Year 2 pupils will be together at these times. We also teach some lessons in year groups E.g. Phonics. This is a complex operation and, unfortunately, it is not possible to consult with parents and children; it is difficult to please everyone, but I ask parents/carers to respect our professional judgement. Also, classes cannot be changed once parents/carers and children have been informed.

It is really important that parents/carers and pupils don't perceive the split year group as pupils 'moving up' and 'staying down'- children will not be held back! The ways in which learning and teaching are organised in primary schools means that teaching and work is tailored to the needs and current achievement levels of each and every individual pupil. The staff at Curry Rivel Church of England Primary school are very experienced at planning and delivering work to match the needs of mixed age learning. They provide challenge for higher attainers and support for those needing more help no matter which year group or class they are currently in.

Transition

At this time of year we are preparing for your child's transition. Much of the behind the scenes work will continue as usual: teachers will have 'handover meetings' and the school's SENDCo will meet with teachers about Special Educational Needs provision. In the coming weeks, staff will contact individual families where specific transition planning is required (E.g. medical). The children will have the opportunity to meet their new teachers on Thursday 6th July (morning)- please note that this date has changed due to teacher strike action which has affected the secondary school.
