Class sizes	Teachers were very strict and there were
	sometimes more than 60 children in a class!
P.E lessons	Children took part in PE lessons called 'drills'.
	They had to march on the spot, do simple
	stretches and swing big wooden clubs around,
	to work on their strength
Lessons for boys	Boys would be taught carpentry, and girls learnt
and girls	how to sew, knit, cook and use a flat iron. Some
	girls and boys were also taught gardening
Monitors	Pupils, who behaved well, were given special
	classroom 'monitor' jobs, including 'Bell Ringer',
	'Ink Monitor' and 'Blackboard Monitor'.
