We will be demonstrating 'courageous advocacy' by supporting the important work of the Curry Rivel Foodbank, and ask that children bring dried foodstuffs (tins or packets) to the Harvest service. We would like to make a special harvest display both in school and at church- we would welcome donations of a few ears of corn, wheat or barley.

# School Development Plan

We are always want the best for our children and we are always striving to improve. The Governing Board of the school works with the school leadership to develop the priorities for the year ahead. This year, our priorities are:

# Rewards

Our School Rules are the foundation of a secure, happy and safe environment within which we all relate, thrive and learn. It is generally agreed that rewarding good behaviour generates yet more good behaviour. A universal, whole school approach to positive behaviour is essential. We would like to explain our positive behaviour approach to our new children and remind you all about how we reward our children for making great behaviour choices. Children are awarded merits when they have demonstrated positive behaviours throughout the school. These merits can be awarded by any member of staff and are recorded on the on-line platform 'Class Dojo'. When a pupil achieves a total of 50 merits they receive a 50 merit certificate in Celebration Assembly- these are then followed by 100, 150 200 merit certificates throughout the year. Each month, we calculate the average number of merits achieved by each house with a cup going to the highest scoring house. This is a collective approach to positive behaviour throughout the school. Talk to your child about how they have earned their merits.

# More Rewards

We are working hard as a whole school on achieving good attendance for all of our pupils. Each week there will be class cups for the class with the highest attendance and also the class with the most improved attendance.

# Lates

We are aiming to reduce the number of pupil who arrive late each week- hopefully we can achieve this next week.

Please remember that being late can lead to your child:

- Feeling embarrassed in front of their friends
- Missing the beginning of vital lessons making them fall behind
- Missing important instructions for the rest of the school day
- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future



The impact of being just a little late can accumulate to a loss of learning time.

5 mins	3.4 days
10 mins	6.9 days
15 mins	10.3 days
20 mins	13.8 days
30 mins	20.7 days
