## Maigold's Live lesson- Manta Rays



The children learnt all about Manta Rays, their habitat and how the Manta Ray Trust look after them and protect them. The children learnt what 'endangered' means and got to see pictures of Kate and her team with the Manta Rays. Maigold class were so involved and enthusiastic, with lots of brilliant questions.

## Wellington Maths Challenge- Message form Mr Bridgeman

Well done to Harry, Joseph, Casper and William in Year 6, who represented our school at the Wellington Maths Challenge last Saturday. The challenge consisted of 25 high-level reasoning and problem-solving questions, which the children had to work collaboratively to solve over the course of an hour. Our team scored a fantastic 10 points, and gave up their time at the weekend to represent our school and challenge themselves.

## Stand Up to Violence: Year 6

Stand Up to Violence is a charity which works in communities throughout the UK to give people a chance to live in a world without violence. The charity was established in 2005 in response to the murder of 17-year-old Lloyd Fouracre, who was beaten to death by a group of drunken youths.

George, from the charity said, 'It was an absolute pleasure to work with your Year 6 class yesterday. Thank you for inviting SAV into school once again to share Lloyd's story and be part of their journey as they progress into the final stages of Primary school. Some fantastic participation and engagement - well done Year 6!'

90% pupils found it useful, and 100% would recommend the session to other schools. The pupils said they learned:

- That bullying can hurt
- What may start as a joke can leave deep scars.
- To talk to people and not bottle up feelings
- That violence has loads of effects on people also the new law about if your friends have done something illegal and you were a bit involved you will be imprisoned.
- To let emotions out by talking about them instead of clogging them out
- That violence doesn't solve anything and to tell people your problems so your actions don't result in violence.
- I learnt more how county lines work
- I learnt about Lloyd's story and to forgive someone even if they did something
- I learnt that to be great at things you have to fail (first attempt in learning)
- That violence is never the answer to anything and if you are struggling at home talk to someone and don't hurt for satisfaction.
