Our school is truly rooted in our community, as demonstrated in just one week at Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School. We have welcomed families into school for Parents' Evenings; we had 27 volunteers here for volunteer day on Saturday (please see them at work in the photos below); the Parish Council have attended our Parents' Evenings so they can get to know the families they serve, and Rev Scott has led worship teaching us about the wisdom of 'building on the rock'. Finally, the school community supported Mr Bridgeman in completing the London Marathon and raising money for a charity close to his heart, Spinal Muscular Atrophy UK.



Attendance

The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

• In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who regularly attended school.

• 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, compared with 84% of regular attenders. And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:

• More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.

But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

• Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.

We know that parents and carers worry about their children's mental health. Rather than keeping your child off school, let us know about your concerns. We can then work together on supporting your child. It can be difficult to know whether your child is too ill to attend school. NHS guidance is clear that it's fine to send them in with a minor cough or common cold, provided they don't have a temperature.

SENDCO Cafes

Place2Be

Place2Be is a safe and calming space during lunchtime that children are able to access. Our school ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) Mrs Langford runs Place2Be in the Russet Room and is able to offer emotional support for the children.

Blenheim, Camelot and Discovery- 12.10-12.30

Gala, Maigold and Pippin- 12.30-12.55

During their time in Place2Be, they are able to do a range of mindfulness activities and talk to Mrs Langford. Place2Be allows the children to self-refer if they require emotional support. Adults in school are also able to refer children if they need some time to regulate or a safe space to manage their emotions. It is still important that we are all trusted adults for all children and we all give support first and not refer to Place2Be straight away as any of us can potentially resolve an issue or solve a problem. Place2Be needs is used as a calm space for children to regulate and share worries…but not for getting out of the rain with their friends!

Clerk to Governors

Due to the retirement of the current post holder, we are looking to appoint a new Clerk to the Governing Body.

We need someone who:

- Has experience as an administrator
- Is IT literate
- Is well organised
- Has good communication skills
- Is able to take accurate minutes at meetings
- Is able to maintain impartiality and handle confidential minutes

You should be reliable and have a flexible approach. Previous clerking experience is not essential as full training and support will be provided.

The role is primarily term time. Meetings are generally held after school, between 4pm and 6pm, although occasionally, by agreement, these may happen at other times. Meetings are sometimes held online.

The holder of office will be required to liaise with the Head Teacher and Chair of Governors to set an appropriate agenda which, together with the associated documents, needs to be shared, in good time, with the relevant members of the Governing Body. They will then be required to take detailed, accurate minutes and get them typed up and shared within a week of the meeting. In addition, they will be expected to manage all governing body information effectively in accordance with legal requirements and provide support to the governing body in order to meet its statutory duties.

Other than attendance at meetings, the role will be flexible and carried out at home, at times of the day to suit the Clerk, whilst ensuring agreed deadlines are met. They will be supported by Somerset Governor Services.

The role of Clerk to Governors provides a valuable insight into education and a school environment, providing an ideal stepping stone for someone looking to get into a school-based administration role.

Curry Rivel C of E Primary is committed to safeguarding and promoting the safety and welfare of children. You will be expected to share this commitment and all appointments will be subject to appropriate vetting including an enhanced DBS disclosure check.

A full application pack will be available soon, but we hope that this will give you something to consider.
