Class Structure September 2024

We have worked tirelessly on our school budget, within very difficult economic conditions, but the Governing Board and I are delighted that the school can retain the **six-class structure** for the next academic year. Our class structure, from September, will be:

- Reception
- Year 1/Year 2
- Year 2/Year 3
- Year 3/Year 4
- Year 5
- Year 6

This structure means that there are approximately equal numbers of pupils in each class.

Is the situation different in my child's school from that in other schools? It is fair to say that different situations pertain in all schools. Many schools in Somerset have no choice but to form some or all mixed age classes due to the number of classes they are funded for. In none of these schools is the formation of mixed age classes of itself an issue or a concern. 76% of primary schools in Somerset have formed mixed age classes, and there is absolutely no evidence (locally, nationally or internationally) to suggest that being in a mixed age class has any detrimental effect whatsoever on the education of children in that class.

Do mixed age classes have fewer pupils in them? The maximum size of any class with infant (Key Stage One) children will usually be restricted to 30 children, whilst this is more flexible in Key Stage Two; currently all of our classes will have fewer than 30 pupils. Our 'admission number' (which the Local Authority uses when applications for places are made) means that our class sizes could grow.

How will the classes be created?

For Years 2 and 3, I will work closely with the teachers to create the classes where the year group is spread between two groups. The factors we try to take into account are: numbers of pupils, gender balance, attainment, SEND needs, class dynamics, peers children work well with and friendships. Meetings and discussions are held over a period of time to establish the classes. This is a complex operation and unfortunately, it is not possible to consult with parents and children; it is difficult to please everyone, but I ask parents/carers to respect our professional judgement. Please note that it will not be possible to guarantee that friendship groups will be kept together. Also, classes cannot be changed once parents/carers and children have been informed.

Will my child be held back if she/he is placed in a mixed age or split year group class? Definitely not! The ways in which learning and teaching are organised in primary schools means that teaching and work is tailored to the needs and current achievement levels of each and every individual pupil. The staff at Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School are very experienced at planning and delivering work to match the needs of mixed age learning. They provide challenge for the more able children and support for those needing more help no matter which year group they are currently in.

But forming a mixed age or split year group class may mean that my child's friendship grouping is being broken

up? Although care is taken in allocating pupils to classes, their social needs are not ignored. In general terms it is likely to be good for children to experience classes with different classmates so that their circle of friends and acquaintances can be extended beyond the traditional age boundaries. Certainly when children transfer to secondary school, new friendship groupings in different subject areas become a fact of life, and this situation is generally welcomed by many children. The school will make every effort to ensure that each individual child's transition between classes is as smooth as we can possibly make it.

Are there any other benefits to the arrangements? Children benefit in many ways from the opportunity to become an 'expert' for the younger children and a positive role model which the younger children often aspire to. This 'vertical' grouping often nurtures thinking & problem-solving skills, vocabulary & social competences. There is often a greater sense of cooperation and opportunities to work with a wider circle of peers.

We will inform you about your child's class for September after June half term. **If you have any concerns or queries, I** ask that you raise them with myself as soon as possible.
