Reading in Pippin Class

Reading is a skill we continue to develop throughout our lives, but starting this process as early as possible has significant benefits for our continued success as readers.

This is why, as parents and carers, you play a vital role in supporting your child in becoming a fluent reader who is confidently able to apply their reading skills across all areas of their lives. Research suggests that children who read regularly outside of school perform significantly better in school assessments and so your support at home is essential in ensuring that your child makes the progress they are capable of.

You can help your child to achieve their full potential by listening to them read their school reading books daily (even if only 10 minutes!), reading bedtime stories to them and by encouraging them to enjoy reading and sharing books together. To help us track reading, it is important that you sign their reading record each time.

If you require any further guidance regarding reading, please ask!

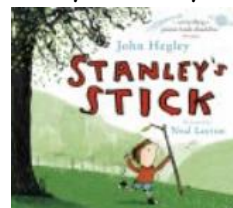
