This is about getting separated parents together so they can have conversations and hopefully find the "one thing" that may help in reducing conflict. At the Parenting Cafes, parents will have the opportunity to meet and chat with other parents who are going through similar experiences in a relaxed, non-judgemental space. 1. How to develop a successful co-parenting relationship and reduce conflict.

2. Understand how you can stay connected with your children and support them with smooth handovers and transitions.

3. Find out more about practical tools to reduce conflict in co-parenting communications. 4. How to manage different ways of parenting in different homes.
