## Planned spending Actions for 2016/17

- Delivery of Talk Boost: To develop communication and language skills in Phase 1. Purchase of resources and LSA time to deliver programme
- Extra LSA in Phase 1 3 days a week to support access to play base learning for pupils
- New LSA training provided eg. Phonics, Spelling detectives, EAL and ILI
- Resources to support Play Based learning and experiences in Phase 1

- Extension of ELSA to include another member of staff to provide Emotional Literacy support to our pupils at vulnerable times.
- Training for LSA's on phonics, grammar and punctuation, spelling, guided reading and mathematics
- Training for LSA's on age related learning in their phase
- Designated teacher to monitor Pupil Premium progress
- Attendance audit
- New LSA in Phase 1 to deliver or help to deliver wave 2 and wave 3 interventions
- Development of OPAL (outdoor play and learning) in playtimes and lunchtimes, to develop children's creativity, activity and problem solving. Improve social interaction and reduce social problem
- Training of Forest school leaders in school to deliver outdoor learning in New Forest School
- Subsidy or curriculum related trips
- Targetted specific reading books that support dyslexic readers
- Dylexia friendly materials including coloured whiteboards and Learning Journey books. (ongoing)
- Purchase of Numicon and Numicon training for LSA's to provide early maths interventions.
