- 2. Report back to their class following meetings.
- 3. Believe in the importance of representing their class's point of view even if they do not agree with it themselves.
- 4. Initiate discussion and debate with fellow pupils
- 5. Understand that as a school council representative, they have the obligation to participate in making decisions about the school, along with staff and school governors.

If your child would like to be a member of our school council, children need to let their class teacher know with a poster explaining who you are and why pupils should vote for you. Please hand in by Monday 25th September, as voting will take place on Thursday 28th September.
