### **Children's Mental Health Week 2025**

We are so pleased to have taken part in Children's Mental Health Week 2025. This year's theme is 'Know Yourself, Grow Yourself'. It is so important we understand what makes us tick, our likes and dislikes, strengths, fears, hopes and dreams. Our emotions play a key role in telling us just that, and being aware of how to listen to and express ourselves is a major part of building self-awareness. It is through knowing ourselves and speaking with others, that we can build resilience, grow and develop. 1 in 5 children and young people now have a probable mental health condition. By taking part in Children's Mental Health Week 2025, we are ensuring our children feel listened to, and know that they're not alone. There has been a special assembly, class-based activities and 'Express Yourself' non-uniform days for each class.

#### **Online Safety and Inappropriate Content**

At Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School we take the safety and wellbeing of our pupils very seriously, both in school and beyond. Recently, we have become aware that some children may be accessing inappropriate videos/films and games online, which could expose them to harmful or unsuitable content.

As children grow and explore the digital world, they may sometimes come across materials that are not ageappropriate. While this may be unintentional in some cases, we want to ensure that all our pupils remain safe online and are equipped with the skills to navigate the internet responsibly.

We strongly encourage all parents and carers to take an active role in monitoring their child's online activity. Here are some steps you can take to support your child's digital safety:

- Talk openly with your child about their online experiences and the importance of responsible internet use.
- Set parental controls on devices, apps, and websites to limit exposure to inappropriate content.
- Encourage safe browsing habits by discussing which websites, games, and videos are suitable for their age.
- Use child-friendly search engines or content filters to help create a safer online environment.
- Monitor screen time and ensure children are using devices in shared family spaces rather than in private.

If you have any concerns or would like further advice on how to safeguard your child online, please do not hesitate to contact us. We also recommend visiting resources such as NSPCC, Internet Matters, or Childnet for further guidance. If the school has any concerns regarding content your child is accessing, we will be in contact with you. Thank you for your continued support in keeping our children safe both in school and at home.
