The children have been working hard on their return from half term- it has been good to see their progress across the curriculum but particularly in their writing- Maigold class pupils have been particularly impressive! The development of oracy skills continues to be a focus, and all classes demonstrate great active listening, with children able to explain their 'discussion guidelines'. Mr Bridgeman has been promoting oracy in maths, and the children have been challenged with various activities like the one below for Year 4:



We are approaching an important time in the Church Calendar. Lent is a special time for Christians that lasts for about 40 days. It starts on a day called Ash Wednesday and ends just before Easter. During Lent, Christians remember the time when Jesus spent 40 days in the desert, praying and fasting. One of the important things Christians think about during Lent is forgiveness. We will be learning how forgiveness means letting go of anger and hurt when someone has done something wrong to you. It's like giving someone a second chance. Lent helps us all to:

Reflect: Think about our actions and how we can be better people.

Pray: Spend more time talking to God or thinking about how we might forgive others.

Give Up Something: Sometimes, we might give up a favourite treat or activity

Help Others: We try to do good deeds and be kind to others.



Carymoor Environmental Centre runs education programmes and demonstrations of renewable energy and sustainable buildings, and the centre has developed a reputation that exemplifies environmental good practice. Maigold class will be visiting the centre soon on their school trip, but the centre is visiting us on Tuesday, presenting to the whole school and running workshops for Maigold and Camelot.

Escape Line

Escape Line will be here on 21st March to lead a workshop for Year 6 pupils, and a parent/carers workshop 2.30-3.15 pm- please let the office know if you can attend so we know how many people to cater for. Please can I encourage you to come, especially if you feel 'this wouldn't happen to my child'. In the South West of the UK, including all areas of Somerset, there is a significant rise in county lines drug crime, whereby a large amount of young people as young as 6 years old, are being criminally and sexually exploited by gangs.

These gangs proactively recruit young people to drug run in and around the South West, as well as outside the area. The gangs and criminal networks use extreme violence and intimidation towards these young people, which result in these young people feeling trapped and scared. They also train these young people to become recruiters and future gang members.

The charity Escapeline are providing workshops in schools designed to help young people gain greater awareness of grooming, recruitment and positive friendships at an age appropriate level.

World Book Day- Thursday 6th March 2025

On World Book Day, children are welcome to come dressed as their favourite book character. This is a fantastic opportunity for the children to express their love for literature and to showcase their creativity. Whether it's Harry Potter, The Gruffalo, or a character from their favourite Roald Dahl story, we can't wait to see the wonderful costumes!

In addition to dressing up, we would like children to bring along a book to share with the class. This could be a story they cherish or a new favourite they've discovered.

We are also excited to introduce a fun and exciting competition - creating a story in a jar! This involves children representing a favourite book inside a jar using small objects, pictures, or even drawings that signify different elements of their tale. You can google 'story in a jar' to find some inspiration. There will a prize for the winning jar in each class.
