Lunchboxes

As a parent myself, I know the challenges of packing a convenient and affordable child's packed lunch. To support children's nutrition and to help avoid sugar rushes (which can effect behaviour), chocolate bars, chocolate covered bars and sweets should not be included in packed lunch boxes. Break time snacks can be fruit, vegetables, or a sandwich. For those children who eat school dinners, we encourage the children to use a knife and fork, which I know you will be teaching at home too.

Online Safety

Defined as "ongoing hurtful behaviour towards someone online", cyber-bullying makes its victims feel upset, uncomfortable and unsafe. In the digital world, it has numerous forms – such as hurtful comments on a person's posts or profile; deliberately leaving them out of group chats; sharing embarrassing images or videos of someone; or spreading gossip about them. Cyberbullying can severely impact a young person's mental health ... so, in support of Anti-Bullying Week, we've provided a list of tips to help trusted adults know what to look for and how to respond to it. In the guide, you'll find tips such as playing online games with your child, talking about your child's online life and being prepared to listen without showing any judgement or criticism.
