Alongside amazing curriculum learning, there have been so many opportunities for the children to experience wider learning and enrichment: This week all classes met local Artist 'Sarah', who shared her creative energy and ideas, inspiring the children to create pieces of work using a range of media- we were very grateful to Sarah for the time she gave us voluntarily. In worship, we have been learning about the meaning of 'Advent' and the symbolism of the Advent Wreath and Candles (Thank you Noah in Year 6 for making this for us). On Saturday 30th November, it is St Andrew's Day and of course with our link with St Andrew's church this has been an opportunity to learn about the life of the Patron Saint of Scotland and the Saltire flag. Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School's Primary Futures programme continues with a visit to Gala and Maigold from Helicopter Pilot Simon Hall. The children are all learning the Carols for our special Christmas Service, and we are excited to see the development of the Reception and Key Stage one Nativity!

Gal Trip

Gala class had a wonderful day on Wednesday visiting the Fleet Air Arm museum which linked to the class's History topic of World War 2. The children explored different types of WW2 aircraft and had the task of finding hidden boxes across the museum, working out the padlock code and exploring the different items in the boxes. The children found a WW2 child's suitcase which they took when evacuated from their home, WW2 rationings and much more.

'Tuning into Kids is an evidence-based parenting programme that focuses on the emotional connection between parents and children. In particular, the programme teaches parents skills in emotion coaching, which is to recognise, understand and respond to children's emotions in an accepting, supportive way. This approach helps the child to understand and manage their emotions. The programme has been shown to improve parenting, parent-child relationships and children's emotional competence and behaviour.'

Sustainable Somerset- Report from Mrs Davies

Our school council have been working over the past 2 years in making a difference to the future of our school and specifically how we can help minimise impact of Climate Change at home, at school and in the working environment.

We attended the Somerset Sustainable Futures launch event on 26 November at Taunton Rugby Club which was run in partnership with the National Centre for Computing Excellence, Dorset and Somerset Training Provider Network, Ministry of Eco Education and Somerset Council.

Our school was represented by Paige, Sienna, Anna, Dylan, Bella and Dot with Mrs Davies. Our Governor, Mrs Pead, also attended with us.

We took part in discussions and interactive sessions with large employers about roles in the construction industry, the National Trust, Environment Agency, Wessex Water, the Hydrographic Office and Yeovil College.

There was a Key Note speech from 14 year old James Lawson who represents Somerset in the National Youth Parliament. He is campaigning about 'Young People and the Fragile Environment'. His speech highlighted the climate crisis, raising awareness of environmental challenges, encouraged people to treasure the natural world around us, and supporting projects to identify ways in which we can do our part locally to create a positive impact globally.

There was also a youth voice session where we were asked for our views about Climate Change and Climate Action in Somerset. The intention is for the responses from these sessions to influence and shape the vision for Somerset Sustainable Futures and guide priority actions.

The children were really interested and involved and represented the school beautifully.
