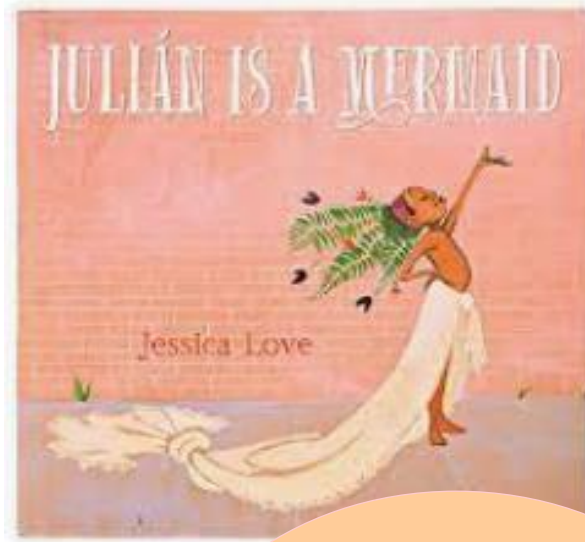



Rhyme	Words with similar sounding final syllables
Rhythm	Patterns that make things easier to remember.
Line breaks	To help slow down the reader.
Metaphor	Tells the reader that something <u>is</u> something.
Simile	Tells the reader that something is <u>like</u> or <u>as</u> something else.
Imagery	Gives the reader help to form a picture in their mind.
Repetition	Repeat a word or phrase
Syllable	The beats of words. Breaking words into smaller parts helps us to spell.
Poem	A piece of writing in which the expression of feelings and ideas is given intensity.

Phoneme	A single unit of sound
Grapheme	A letter, or combination of letters, that corresponds to a single phoneme within a word
Diagraph	A type of grapheme where two letters represent one phoneme (sound)
Consonants	Most of the letters of the alphabet represent consonants; the letters a, e, i, o, u represent vowels
Vowels	The letters a, e, i, o, u
Segment	Break a word into phonemes
Blend	Put the phonemes back together
Key word/ Common exception word	A word which can't be phonetically decoded
