Uniform Consultation You said:

- You like the existing school jumpers and cardigans with the logo, but many also said they like to have a choice
- 50: 50 split for white versus purple polo shirts. Many of you commented that purple polo shirts last longer as they are easier to keep clean and wash better. Some people were concerned about the availability of purple polo shirts and the cost of logo shirts.
- You like the choice between Curry Rivel logo polo shirts and supermarkets polo shirts
- You like the idea of charcoal grey trousers/skirts rather than black

Other comments included:

- The PTA preloved shop helps everyone to afford the branded clothing.
- A few people preferred the fleece.
- A few comments about the quality of the logo cardigans being poor.
- I think having the choice between school logo and supermarket brands gives the option for everyone's budgets. The purple polo shirts are easier to keep clean and tidy
- Please do not make it mandatory to have a school logo on uniform. This is often the most expensive option and many would like to keep costs down
- Phase out the other colour polo shirt
- Keep a clear formality on black shorts or jogging bottoms to be worn in P.E also.
- This feels like a change is related to marketing and making the school look good rather than something that will benefit the children, their education or families.
- Please can it be brought to the attention of Brigade that the hood on the hoodies are too short/small for the size of the jumper, also the stitching on the cuff and sleeve has come undone after only a few months.
- The quality of Brigade's seams and cuffs are not great and fall apart. Their colours are not consistent either.

Uniform from September 2024

- There will be a phased transition, with the adjusted uniform to be in place by July 2025.
- The provision of preloved uniform is an absolute must for the environment, to reduce costs and to recycle- the PTA will continue with this amazing service
- Curry Rivel logo uniform and supermarket brands will always be an option for parents.
- We will feedback concerns regarding quality to Brigade.

 return clothes that are found and also to help the children when they are changing. Also, especially
 when your child is young, velcro or elastic on shoes is much easier for them rather than laces. We
 also ask that every child has a waterproof coat every day of the year so that they are properly dressed
 for outside play.

Brigade have been contacted about quality comments and their response is here: 'We regards to the feedback from parents, we produce 1000s of garments of every year and receive hardly any complaints. However if a parents does deem the garments they have received not good enough, we will always replace it. All they need to do is get in touch with our customer service team. Also, with regards to the hoodie size, it's a standard industry size hood which is not produced by Brigade- however as you can imagine we can't cater for all varying head sizes.'

Fundraising

The Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School Community are always so generous when we fundraise, whether for school, national or international causes. This year we are focussing our attention on other causes, but unfortunately not Comic Relief.

Mrs Bridgeman says: In April of this year, I will be running the 2024 London Marathon in aid of SMA UK. Spinal muscular atrophy (SMA) is a genetic disease affecting the central nervous system, peripheral nervous system,

and voluntary muscle movement. My brother George was diagnosed with SMA at the age of 17, and it has since prevented him doing many of the things that he loves. Currently, there is no cure for SMA, and I know that it affects so many people in such life-changing ways, both physically and mentally. By running this marathon, I will be running it for George, to raise awareness of SMA and the importance of funding continued research to find a cure for a brighter future for all those affected. On March 22nd, we invite the children to come to school wearing sky blue (the colours of the SMA UK charity), to celebrate our differences and raise money for this fantastic cause. The children are asked to bring a voluntary £1 donation, and will be taking part in a few running challenges on the day to score points for their houses.

World Book Day- Thursday 7th March 2024

This year's theme is all about embracing the unique reading choices of each child. With this in mind, we invite the children to come in dressed up as the character that they would most like to see in a story.
